Flu Shots will be offered by Health Ministries

Contact Margaret Blair, (626) 574-1827 for a reservation. Leave your name and contact phone number. This will be a drive-through program. We are doing only people over the age of 18 years. Note that we are offering the trivalent vaccine which is being provided through Methodist Hospital, not the quadrivalent vaccine. The quadrivalent, which is stronger than the trivalent & recommended & licensed for those over the age of 65 years, may be obtained through your physician or local pharmacy. The CDC recommends that almost everyone 6 months and older receive a flu shot by the end of October to boost their immune systems and prevent complications from the flu.

Celebrating 75 Years of Christian Ministry and Mission

Through the Years Forming Fellowship Groups

It is not surprising to learn that, when our church opened, members began forming Fellowship groups. That's what Methodists do, isn't it? Gather together in small groups to worship and to socialize? By the end of the first year, all age levels had established themselves. We have their



annual reports to give us a glimpse of their interests and projects. To read those reports from 1945-8 brings feelings of both pride and nostalgia. This was the post-World War II era, a time for new hope and fresh faith. People gathered together in ever-increasing numbers, as the following reports show. To capture the flavor of all the groups' interests and donations, we're going to take the time over two weeks to describe them.

The Women's Society of Christian Service grew from 52 to 68 members in just a couple of years. They organized neighborhood circles for the first time. Their projects were diverse: sponsoring Brownie and Bluebird troops, providing a Sunday morning nursery, and making vestments for the Junior High choir. Gifts of about \$1,400 went to the WSCS mission program, the parsonage project, released time for the church program, and the church's building and furnishing fund.

The Church School grew quickly in the church's first year, with average attendance of 85 in June and of 173 only nine months later. Eight or ten new students were enrolled each week, making a total of 326 at the time the report was written. Arrangements were made with Holly Avenue School for use of their auditorium to provide additional meeting space.

Challengers Young Adult Fellowship started in 1946 and within a year had 26 members, with about 20 usually attending meetings in members' homes or in the Study bi-weekly. For part of the year, they met at a morning church school class to hear a variety of speakers. Several meetings were devoted to working with mentors to help develop a peace plan. For fun, the Challengers spent a snowy weekend retreat at Wrightwood. They sent CARE package to Germany, and they donated \$100 to the building fund.

Next week we'll see what other Fellowship groups did when they started.


